The CAPTRUST made over \$450,000 to 45 charities around the country. The Giving thanks campaign was made possible through donations from hundreds of CAPTRUST employees.




CRISIS HOUSE AIDS THE COMMUNITY WITH FOOD BASKET DISTRIBUTION

CRISIS HOUSE ADAPTS TO COVID

The Crisis House has been in operation for 39 years, during this time programs, populations, policies and staff have changed to meet the needs of the clients. During 2019 we were fortunate to receive funding to remodel our first floor and kitchen. Much to our surprise, not a day to soon, we now have more space in the "common room" and the reception area to keep everyone safe and separated during the pandemic. COVID has changed many ways we operate, while still providing temporary shelter, the number of individuals at the shelter is half than normal to abide by social distancing, housing only 8-9 individuals. We have kept residents longer than usual due to the pandemic, therefore we haven't served as many as in recent years, but have served those in residence for longer periods of time. Staff has had to fill the gaps left by volunteers, who traditionally came in the shelter to provide workshops and services. During the pandemic we are not permitting any one other than staff and residents in the shelter. All new residents are tested before admittance and daily temperature checks are mandatory. The staff has pulled together to get us through this unique time. We would have been unable to continue our services without the commitment and endurance of our shelter staff guided by our senior case manager, Maggie Glick.
